Orange shirt day is a legacy of the St. Joseph Mission residential school commemoration event held in Williams Lake, BC in the spring of 2013. It grew out of residential school survivor Phyllis's account of having her shiny, new orange shirt taken away on her first day of school at the Mission and it has become an opportunity to keep the discussion on all aspects of residential schools happening annually. It sets the stage for anti-racism and anti-bullying awareness and is an opportunity for First Nations, local governments, schools and communities to come together in the spirit of reconciliation and hope for generations of children to come.
