TRACK & FIELD

For the past three weeks grade three to seven students have been running, jumping and throwing their hearts out! They have been participating in Track and Field Rotations in order to get ready for our School Track Meet which is Tuesday May 15 at NDSS in Nanaimo. All grade 3-7 students will be bussed there and will participate rain or shine.

We are sharing our track meet with Cinnabar Valley School. Their staff are in charge of the running events and we are taking care of the field events. Students are only "in competition" with students from their own school though.

Athletes will get to pick between 4-6 events to participate in. They must all do at least one running event and one field event. Students compete in their age category.

For each event and age category, we are allowed to bring four students to the Zone Track Meet Finals on May 29. Athletes are allowed to participate in three events at this Zone Meet. Our super athletes who qualify for more than three events, will have to drop events. Any students who qualify in the top four at the Zone Meet get to go to the District Meet on June 7. Ribbons are awarded at the Zone and District Track Meets.

A permission notice will be coming home soon for our School Meet.

We are in need of at least 18 parent volunteers to help us run the field events and others to help supervise students in the stands. Hope you can make it there.

Thanks to the work of our secretary, Christine De Vries, Ecole North Oyster School has received a Vancouver Sun Adopt-a-School grant to support our students in need. The grant provides \$10,000 to help pay for food for our school's Breakfast/Snack/Lunch Program, over a two year period. We have also received \$500 for kitchen equipment and \$500 to provide clothing for students in need.
