Guidelines When Your Child is III

Cold and flu season is upon us! In order to prevent the

spread of germs, please remind your children to wash their hands regularly. Vancouver Island Health Authority also recommends keeping your child at home for 48 hours after symptoms subside if they have been vomiting. If your child is ill and going to be away from school, just phone the office and we'll be sure to excuse them for the day.

Cold/Wet Weather

As the cold weather is now upon us, please ensure your children come to school with weather appropriate clothing. Students go outside during recesses each day, with very few exceptions. Hats, mittens, proper footwear and warm coats are essential in cold weather. At Ecole North Oyster we are appreciative of the wonderful outdoor spaces available for play and learning and we believe in providing fresh air activities for all our students.



In order to ensure accessible parking is available to individuals who require it, we have several designated parking spots on our school property. Please ensure you do not use these spots without an accessible permit. Unfortunately, we have seen these spots being used by vehicles not displaying a permit and this means the spots are not available to those who need them. Thank you for your cooperation in helping ensure equitable parking access for all members of our school community.

Reminder: the parking lot on the school grounds is for Staff Only.

INFORMATION FOR STUDENTS WHO RIDE SCHOOL BUSES

Special Notes to Parents

- Be certain that your child(ren) is at the bus stop on time and that pets are left at home.
- Provide the necessary protection for your child(ren) when going to the bus.
- Be sure your child(ren) is properly dressed and prepared for inclement weather.
- Remember that the proper conduct of your child(ren) is your responsibility.
- Parents and guardians are responsible for any damage to a bus caused by their child(ren).
- Encourage your child(ren) to obey all traffic rules and school bus regulations.
- Students are to use only their assigned bus and regular bus stops unless alternate arrangements have been made in writing.
- Parents/guardians are reminded that they are responsible for their children's safety until they board the bus in the morning and after they leave the bus in the afternoon.
- Parents and students should be aware that buses are equipped with video cameras to monitor student behavior.

Disciplinary Guidelines

Offences	Warning
First	Student and parent(s) must sign a bus behavior report form
Second	Suspension of privileges—2 school days
Third	Suspension of privileges—5 school days
Fourth	Suspension of privileges for balance of school year

Vandalism

Suspension involving vandalism will not normally be lifted until restitution has been made.

Rules for Students Who Ride School Buses

- The bus driver is in charge.
- Smoking, eating or drinking are not permitted on the bus.
- Students should take their seats quickly and remain seated while the bus is in motion.
- The aisle of the bus must be kept clear at all times.
- Leaving waste or other rubbish on the floor or throwing it from the windows of the bus is not permitted.
- Extending arms, legs or head out of the bus windows is extremely dangerous and is not permitted.
- Students should be at the bus stop five (5) minutes before the scheduled pick up time; the bus will not wait for those who are late.
- Students must stay in bus loading zones while waiting and will load and unload the bus in an orderly manner.
- Remain on the shoulder of the road after getting off the bus until the bus leaves and disperse when safe to do so.
- If the bus does not arrive within 20 minutes of the scheduled time students should return home.
- Damage to the bus or equipment should be reported to the driver as soon as possible.
- Students are not to cross in front of a bus.
- Students may not have anything in their possession that may cause injury to anyone else on the hus
- Students are not permitted to use cellular phones or headphones/electronic devices during the loading or unloading process.
- If riding a bus equipped with seatbelts, seatbelts must be used at all times.



Student Transportation Policy

School District 68 (Nanaimo-Ladysmith) will provide transportation, or pay transportation assistance allowance, for students living beyond the established walk limits defined by the Ministry of Education.

Eligibility

Kindergarten to Grade 12 students who are enrolled at their home school, or the francophone program who live beyond the walk limits.

Walk Limits

Grades 1-3 pupils living beyond 4 kilometres (2 ½ miles) from school will be eligible for transportation.

Grades 4-12 pupils living beyond 4.8 kilometres (3 miles) from school will be eligible for transportation.

All Grades 1-12 pupils may be required to walk up to 3.2 kilometres (2 miles) to the nearest bus stop.

Note: Kindergarten mid-day service will be provided only where enrolments warrant busing. **Kindergarten students must be accompanied both to and from the bus stop by a responsible adult.**







Dear Parents/Caregivers of Students in Grade 5,

Bonjour! Have you ever wished your child were fluent in both official languages? Over half a million Canadians have achieved functional bilingualism through French Immersion. In our school district, one student in 10 is enrolled in French Immersion and will graduate ready to pursue a bilingual career or post-secondary studies in French. Over the past 40 years, thousands of students in our district have had great success in Early French Immersion (EFI), which starts in Kindergarten or Grade 1.

If your child is entering Grade 6 in September 2020, they are eligible to enroll in LFI and join those graduating from secondary school with bilingual Dogwood certificates. LFI is a fully funded, 3-year public education program with no additional costs.

Please discuss the LFI option with your child and with other parents. Pending sufficient enrolment, LFI will continue this September at École Quarterway Elementary School. www.quarterway.ca Ideally there will be a class of 29 new Grade 6 students.
